

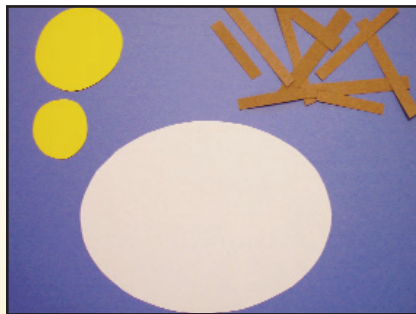

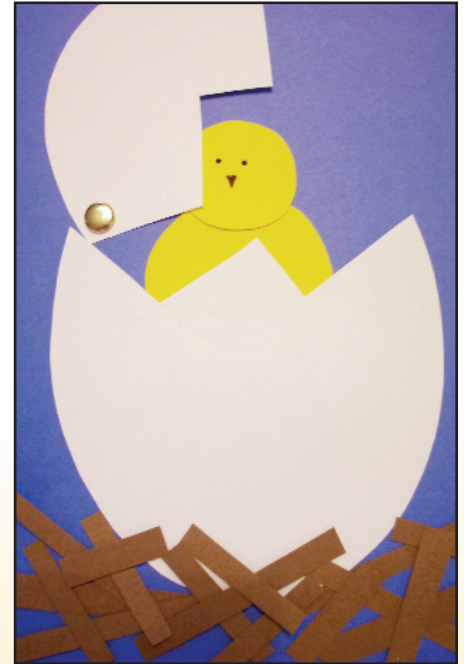
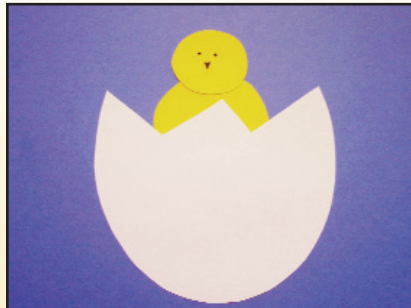
EGG and CHICK

Shopping List

- Blue, Yellow, Brown and White Construction Paper
- Glue Sticks
- Scissors
- Brads
- Black and Brown Markers
- Pencil
- Single Hole Punch

Directions

1. Draw an oval for the egg. Then cut it out and use for a pattern. (Use white construction paper.)
2. Draw small and bigger circles and cut them out to use for a chick pattern. (Use yellow construction paper.)
3. Cut a piece of brown construction paper approx. 6" x 4" into strips; cut those strips into smaller strips to use for the nest.
4. Cut the egg in jagged half as seen in the photo.
5. Draw eyes and a beak on the smaller circle for the chick's face.
6. Glue the big circle for the chick's body in the middle of the blue paper.
7. Glue the smaller circle at the top of the big circle for the chick's head.
8. Glue the bottom of the egg over the bottom of the chick. Make sure you check to see if the "whole" egg is going to cover the "whole" chick.
9. Glue on the nest around the bottom of the egg.
10. Punch a hole in the top part of the egg where you want the brad to go.
11. Place the top of the egg back onto the bottom of the egg.
12. Stick the brad through the hole in the top of the egg then punch it through the construction paper.



For Older Kids: Use the same craft, but you could make a card for a family member, an elderly person or someone who's sick.

This craft is designed to be made with adult help and supervision. Some of the material can be prepared beforehand for easier assembling by the children.
